

The book I am going to read is "Froggy Goes To Bed by Jonathan London."

Reading Tips For Parents:

1. Before reading the story, talk about the book cover. Have your child make a prediction about the story.
2. I animate the story..using a different voice for each character. It helps to keep the children interested.
3. There are times I adlib to make the story more interesting thus keeping the children's attention.
4. After a couple of pages, I stop to ask questions about what I read.

Examples:

Where did Froggy find his boat?

Where did Froggy find his toothbrush?

What did Froggy ask his mom for before he would go to sleep?

5. After reading the story I ask questions about themselves to make them relate to the story.

Examples:

Where would you look for your toothbrush?

Where would you look for your toy boat?

What is your routine when it is bedtime?

Was your prediction that you made before we read the book right?

Is my story true? Why? Why not?
